

Fabric Requirements:

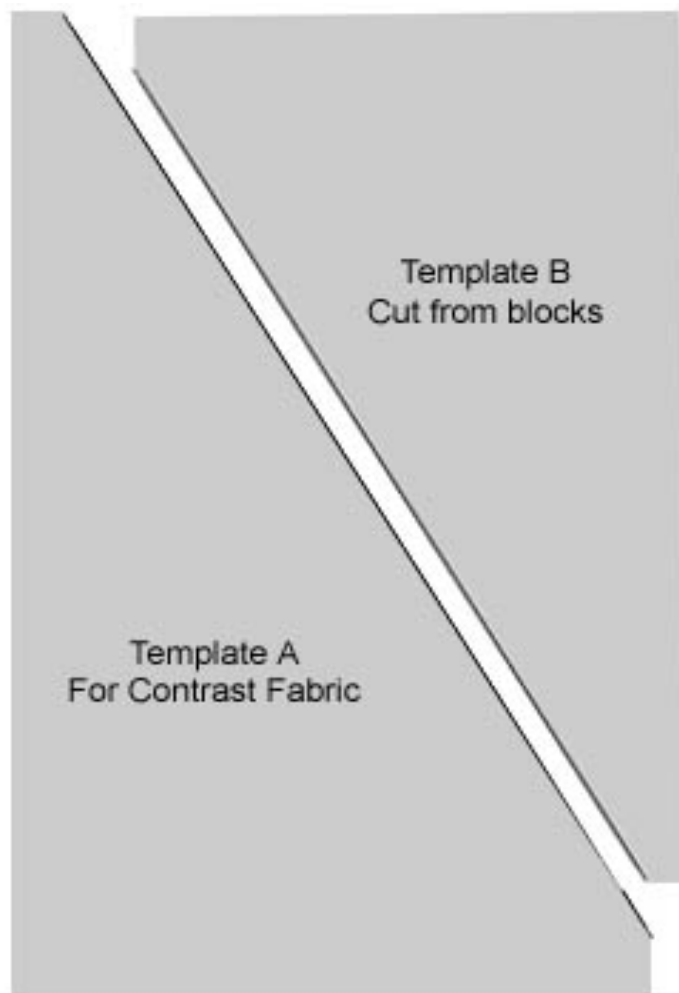
Colors 1-4 are four fabrics from a single color, different tones and prints. Color 5 is the contrasting stars and sashing between blocks. Color 6 is used for the borders. Color 7 is used for the borders.

1/4 yd each – Colors 1 ,2, 3 & 4

2/3 yd – Color 5, contrast

1 yd – Color 6, border

1/4 yd – Color 7, piping

Lap Quilt

Approximately 45" x 52"

Cutting Instructions

From each of the four coordinating fabrics (colors 1-4) cut:

(4) 2" strips by WOF (Width Of Fabric)

From Color 5, contrast fabric cut:

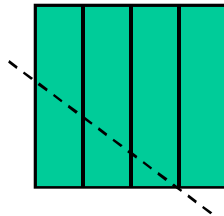
(5) 2" strips

(2) 5 1/4" strip

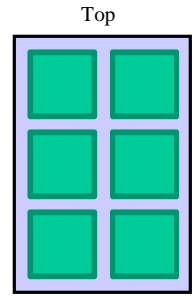
From Color 6 Cut (4) 8" strips by WOF for border (follow line in pattern when cutting)

Piecing Instructions

1. Make four identical strips sets from the 2" strips of colors 1-4 by sewing each fabric lengthwise to the next fabric. Press all seams to one side. Make four strip sets. *Hint: use a little spray on fabric stabilizer to help reduce stretching of the fabric when sewing.*
2. Cut the strip sets every 6 1/2" to make 24 squares.
3. Use template A (larger template) to cut triangles from the 5 1/4" strip of contrast. Do NOT flip the template, all rectangles must be the same. Move the template along the fabric strip, rotating after each cut, for the next triangle.
4. Use Template B (smaller template) to cut a triangle from the corner of each 6 1/2" block. Cut all blocks the same *Hint: Lay your triangles of contrast fabric on the block to make sure you are cutting each block right.*
5. Piece together the 6 1/2" striped block and contrast fabric to complete one unit. Make 24 units.
6. Take four of the 6 1/2" units and lay them out so the contract fabrics form a star; piece together to make one large star block. *Hint: see photo on right for block layout.* Make 6 blocks. Square to 12 1/2".
7. From 2" sashing strips cut (9) 12 1/2" strips and (4) 30 1/2" strips.
8. Attach a 12 1/2" strip to the left side of all 6 blocks, and then attach second 12 1/2" strip to the right side of 3 blocks.



9. Take a block with two sashing strips and attaching it to one with only one sashing strip to complete a row. *Hint see layout on right.* Make 3 rows of two blocks.



10. Layout the 3 rows for the quilt top with a piece of sashing between each row. Sew the sashing to the rows to complete the top.
10. Press the top and square all sides.
11. Sew the border fabric strips together end to end.
12. Measure the quilt top through the center for the length of the quilt. Cut two strips from the piping and two from the border strip to match the length of the quilt. Fold the piping in half wrong sides together and press. Lay piping on top of quilt center and border on top of the piping so all raw edges align and sew layers together. Repeat for second side.
13. Measure the width of the quilt, including the side borders, and cut 2 strips of border fabric and two of the piping to match the length. Sew these to the top and bottom of the quilt top in the same fashion as Step 12. Press borders and piping so piping lays flat on quilt center.
14. Press the quilt top and use a cutting table and ruler to straighten the edges and square off the corners of the quilt.
15. Sandwich with backing fabric and batting, quilt and bind as desired.
